# Notes on Probate Packet 'series'



- The Supreme Court has divided the Probate Packets into five groupings, which they have called 'series'. There is no definitive answer as to why these records were divided in this way. Possible reasons include: statutory change, agency or administrative change and sheer size of each 'series'.
- The five 'series' are as follows:
  - Series 1- April 1817-May 1873
  - Series 2- 1873-1876
  - Series 3- 1876-c.1890
  - Series 4- c.1890-1985
  - Series 5 - 1985 onwards

# Definitions

- **Executor(s)** are the people named in a will to administer the estate of the deceased. Generally involves: determining the assets belonging to the estate; paying any debts and distributing the estate to those entitled to it.
- **Estate** - The real estate property and/or personal property of the deceased.
- **Grant of Probate** - authority given by the Supreme Court to the executor(s) to deal with the deceased's estate. Probate documents certify a will is valid.
- **Letters of administration** - If there is no valid will or the executor(s) are unable to carry out their function, the Supreme issues letters of administration authorising a person(s) to act as executor.
- **Testate** - A person who dies leaving a valid will has died testate. They are often referred to as the testator.
- **Intestate** - A person who dies without leaving a valid will dies intestate. Without a valid will there is no named executor and the Supreme Court NSW issues a letter of administration.



# Probate Packets – what makes them special

- There are Probate Packets for many people who died in NSW
- Listings of Probate packets are being progressively add to *Collection Search*)
- Probate packets are:
  - o indexed (Tip: early probate records are also indexed)
  - o held by State Archives from 1817 to 1976,1989 (some)
  - o open 5 years from date of granting probate
  - o available though the copying service, and
  - o often contain more than the deceased's will
- There may be related records – such as Will books, Deceased Estate Files (1880-1956)

# Probate Packets listed in Collection search



- Transfers to State Archives
    - 'Series' 1-3 and 'series' 4 up to 1976 , part of 1989 have been transferred to State Archives
    - 'Listing in Collection search
    - 'Series' 1, 2, 3 and part of 'series' 4
    - World War I packets have now been entered
    - 1890-1914, 1919-1928 yet to be entered in Collection search

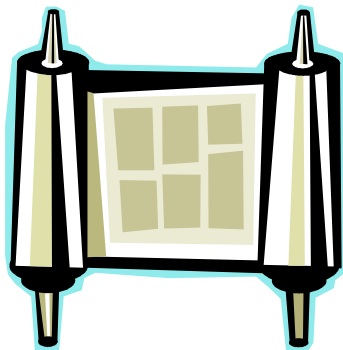


## Sources in The National Archives (United Kingdom)

- Prior to 1858 wills in the UK were proved in one of two ecclesiastical courts. These were the Prerogative Courts of Canterbury (PCC) and York (PCY) which roughly covered the geographic areas: Canterbury - South of England, Wales, York - York, Durham, Northumberland, Westmoreland, Cumberland, Lancashire, Cheshire, Nottinghamshire and the Isle of Man.
- There were three main factors determining in which court a will would be proved:
- Where the person died
- the value of the goods
- and how these goods were distributed geographically.
- Importantly for NSW researchers, if an owner of property in England or Wales died overseas, such as soldiers or sailors, the will was proved in the Prerogative Court of Canterbury (PCC). All PCC wills are indexed and available online at [The National Archives](https://www.nationalarchives.gov.uk). Many relate to military personnel, but there are entries for people such as William Redfern and John Oxley who also appear in the NSW probate records.
- The [Society of Australian Genealogists](https://www.sagenealogy.com) (02) 9247 3953 holds the UK's National Probate Index, 1858-1943 on microfiche.

# Locating early probate records

- Step 1 Check the online index to early probate records  
Tip: There are also copies of the index in the reading rooms.
- Step 2 Note the information provided in the index  
Tip 1: The microfilm reels are available in the reading room  
Tip 2: The item numbers will appear as [X953-54, 6/4185-97] . These records have not been filmed and are available at the Western Sydney Records Centre

Appeared personally William Marshall of Campbelltown in the Colony of New South Wales Sheriff and made oath that Samuel Johnson late of Campbelltown aforesaid better deceased departed this life in the year One thousand eight hundred and thirty seven intestate leaving him surviving Elizabeth Johnson his Widow and two daughters and one son namely Elizabeth (the wife of this deponent) and Julia Johnson and George Johnson both infants that is to say the said Julia Johnson of the age of nine years or thereabouts and the said George Johnson of the age of six years or thereabouts And this deponent further saith that shortly after the decease of the said Samuel Johnson administration of his personal estate and effects was granted by this Honorable Court to the said Elizabeth Johnson his said Widow who thereupon possessed herself thereof to a considerable amount And the said deponent further made oath that a part of the said personal estate consists of a certain herd of cattle which are now in the possession of Archibald Walker of Sydney Merchant as administrator of Luke William Roddall deceased under a contract entered into between the said Luke William Roddall in his life time with the said Elizabeth Johnson as such administrator aforesaid whereby the said Luke William Roddall in consideration of the increase and other profits to be made and derivable from the said cattle agreed to take the care and management thereof for the term of seven years And in the meantime to pay to the said Elizabeth Johnson the yearly sum of One hundred and forty pounds And the said deponent

further made oath that he intermarried with Elizabeth the eldest daughter of the said deceased in the month of October One thousand eight hundred and thirty nine and that he this deponent in right of his said wife is entitled to two thirds parts of the said sum of One hundred and forty pounds and also to two thirds parts of the said cattle at the expiration of the said contract with the said Luke William Roddall deceased And also to two thirds part of all other the personal estate of the said intestate But this deponent saith that he hath not nor hath the said Elizabeth his said wife nor any person for his use or on his account received any part of the said personal estate And this deponent further saith that the said infant Julia Johnson and George Johnson are residing with their said mother the said Elizabeth Johnson And the said deponent further made oath that the said Elizabeth Johnson is of a grossly immoral character is given to habits of intemperance and is now and has been for the last two years living in a state of open concubinage And this deponent further saith that from the aforesaid character and habits of the said Elizabeth Johnson he had reason to believe that the personal estate of the said intestate is likely to be misapplied and all benefit thereof to be wholly lost to this deponent and the said infant children of the said deceased And this deponent further saith that in corroboration of his statement in this behalf he has procured the annexed certificate from various respectable inhabitants of Campbell Town and its vicinity

On the twenty second day of October 1841 the said William Marshall was sworn to the truth of this affidavit before me

## PROBATE INDEX ABBREVIATIONS

<u>Abbreviation</u>	<u>Grant</u>
P.	<u>PROBATE</u> : grant to executor named in the will.
A.	<u>ADMINISTRATION</u> : grant to person entitled under rules of intestacy where deceased left no will.
A. ad coll.	<u>ADMINISTRATION AD COLLIGENDUM</u> : administration for purpose of collecting goods: this is normally an emergency grant made shortly after death; a common example is where the deceased has a business: this grant enables the grantee to carry on the business until a final grant of probate or administration is obtained.
A. ad lit.	<u>ADMINISTRATION AD LITEM</u> : administration for the purpose of beginning a suit.
A. cta.	<u>ADMINISTRATION CUM TESTAMENTO ANNESCO</u> : administration with the will annexed: where will appointed no executor or where executor has died, renounced probate, refused to apply for probate or cannot be found.

*Persons fraudulently misappropriating property or debts.*

60. Any person making or assisting in making any false statement or any fraudulent  
alterations in any statement or document required under this Act with intent to evade the  
payment of duty shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanour and on conviction thereof shall be  
liable to imprisonment for any period not exceeding three years and to a fine not exceeding  
one hundred pounds.

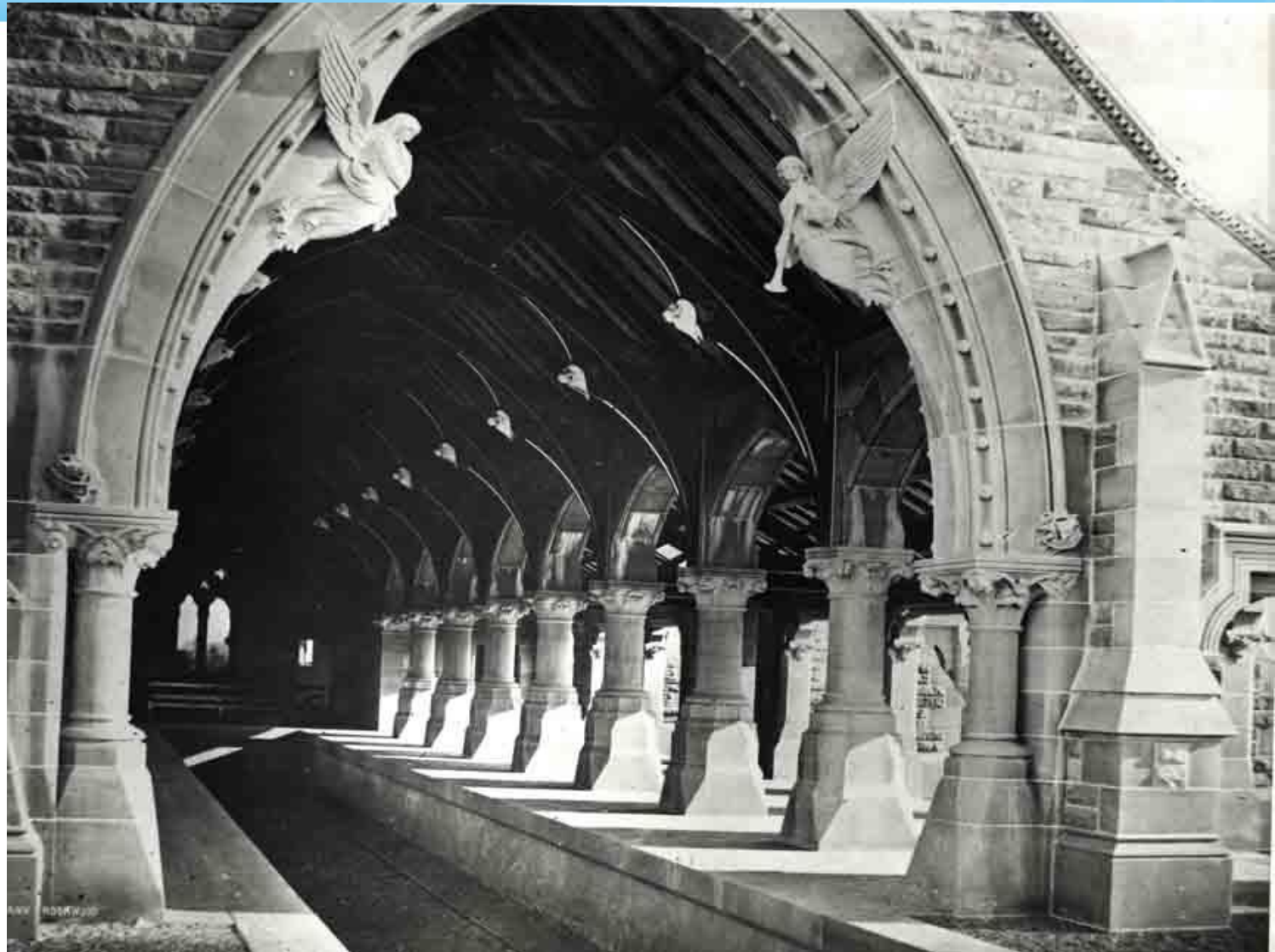
