

# Integrating DNA with Family Tree Programs.

A number of Family Tree programs now have DNA integration facilities. Some don't.

Following are some programs that do integrate DNA tests:

- \* MyHeritage Advanced DNA integration
- \* WikiTree Some DNA integration
- \* Ancestry Advanced DNA integration

Other Family Tree programs do not integrate, at the moment, although they may over time.

Watch out for our Family Tree programs course, where we will note these.
