The Cemeteries covered are:

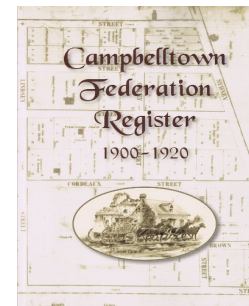
- * St Marks Anglican Cemetery - Appin
