These records relate to the Poor Law, which administered and provided relief to destitute members of a local parish.
When a person arrived in a new parish, they were quizzed by officials before they could receive settlement (permission to settle within a parish, with the parish accepting responsibility for them if they needed relief).

* England Roman Catholic Parish Congregational Records

Do you have English ancestors who were Roman Catholic? Explore thousands of Roman Catholic congregational records from the dioceses of Birmingham, Leeds, Liverpool, Middlesbrough, Nottingham, Plymouth, Salford, Southwark and Westminster in England. Discover your ancestor's relationship with his or her local parish, did they receive their confirmation or were they a benefactor of a parish?
